Stage 1 Water Rationing

As a reminder, we are still under a stage 1 water rationing ordinance. Use of watering through a sprinkler system or use of water through a hose to water any grass, trees, plants or other vegetation shall be determined as follows:

1. Odd number addresses are permitted to use water in the above manner on Wednesdays and Sundays.
2. Even number addresses are permitted to use water in the above manner on Tuesdays and Saturdays.
3. Watering in the above manner shall be prohibited between the hours of 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

APS Updates Community & Seeks Public Input on New Tech Plan

Thank you to the Alamogordo community for supporting the \$7 million Mill Levy that will fundamentally transform and improve educational technology within our district.

This is a vast undertaking and there is much to do in preparation for funds arriving early next year. That is why we will continue to provide regular updates on our progress and seek many layers of feedback and input into our Education Technology plans.

In order to best serve our students now, and well into the future, the district's first priority is to complete a technology infrastructure needs assessment. This will identify the district's current technology infrastructure strengths and weaknesses in order to establish what upgrades are necessary to meet the needs of our modern educational facilities. We are grateful to be working with the New Mexico Public School Facilities Authority in accomplishing our Educational Technology (EdTech) Plan goals and objectives. At no cost to our district, they will help with the planning, construction, and maintenance of facilities and their vast knowledge and experience will guide the district's decision making to ensure a successful outcome for students, teachers and families for many years to come. We are also excited to announce that the district has assembled an "EdTech Steering Committee." This committee's primary responsibilities are to ensure the EdTech Strategic Plan's goals are met in a reasonable and timely manner, that all purchases are made in adherence to procurement procedures and that all monies associated with the EdTech Strategic Plan are effectively and efficiently utilized. This committee is a public body and we encourage all community members to actively engage with their work.

As always, we are committed to receiving input from our community at every step along the way and Alamogordo Public Schools will host several community forums to garner constructive feedback and input for influencing the EdTech Strategic Plan. **The first community forum will be held on Wednesday, September 12, 2018 at Desert Star Elementary School cafeteria beginning at 6:00 p.m. More information will be provided in the coming weeks on opportunities for engagement and public participation.**

These new technology programs will create significant opportunities for classroom modernization, advanced learning in our schools and career development. We truly appreciate and respect the trust that the community has placed in the district to enact this broad vision and look forward to working together to achieve all that we can as a community.
