Alamogordo Public Schools SPECIAL ELECTION - MAIL BALLOT - Mill Levy Election ~ NO TAX INCREASE ~

On April 9th, there will be a 2-mill levy election to continue funding the maintenance and upkeep of the Alamogordo Public Schools. This election is held every six years. If approved, it provides approximately \$1.6 million per year in funding to repair, maintain, and improve YOUR schools. APS operates 1.2 million square feet of school facilities. Mill Levy funds provide \$1.33 per square foot to maintain and repair our schools.

This will **NOT** raise your taxes. Passage re-authorizes and continues the existing mill levy that is already in effect. The District is required every six years to ask the voters to renew the mill levy.

Funds received will be used to:

- Provide school security improvements
- Repair and replace heating & air conditioning equipment
- Repair or replace leaking roofs
- Upgrade plumbing & electrical systems
- Paint and refurbish classrooms
- Maintain and repair playgrounds and athletic fields
- Maintain, repair and replace district vehicles & busses
- Replacement of worn out carpet & tile
- Update and maintain fire alarm and safety equipment

The dollars received by APS from the mill levy flow back into the community, providing a significant economic impact. Because the money is used for facility maintenance and repair, businesses such as our local contractors, hardware stores, concrete suppliers and carpet & tile vendors will be impacted by the outcome of the important election.

Any registered voter who lives in the Alamogordo Public School District is eligible to vote.

Public Works



FOG or fats, oils, and grease have been key criminals in the war on clogs for decades. When poured down sink drains, these viscous villains buildup, prevent the flow of water and eventually block pipes completely. If wastewater can't move freely through pipes and out into the sewer system, it can back up into your home and cause unsanitary conditions and damages that can be expensive to repair. Grease clogs sanitary sewer system much like bad cholesterol and fatty acids clog arteries in the human body. Known agents of FOG include meat fats (bacon, sausage, beef), lard, cooking oil, butter, baking products, milk and dairy products, and other food scraps.

SAVE YOUR SINK

Whether leftovers, peelings, or byproducts, food should never go down the sink! Remember the 3 C's of sink safety: **Cool, Contain, Can**

- 1. Cool:** Let the grease cool and solidify in your cooking pot/pan
- 2. Contain:** Scrape FOG and excess food scraps into a secure, sealable container like a peanut butter jar. Before washing, wipe down pots and pans with a paper towel
- 3. Can:** Throw the full container of FOG and your paper towel into a trashcan.
