



Alamogordo Public Schools



Alamogordo Public Schools is on a Galactic Journey to higher academic success. In an effort to reach these higher goals, APS has incorporated new technologies and strategies to make our students ready to take on the future. This month we want to highlight a strategy to make our students better readers; Fountas and Pinnell Guided Reading. It has been pointed out in much research that children who are not on grade level reading in the early years of elementary school struggle throughout their entire academic career. Instituting Fountas and Pinnell beginning in Kindergarten sets our students up for reading success. Students are taught through guided reading in small groups and the lessons also provide visual aids to improve the student's understanding. With this system, as the students continue to improve as readers they learn to think within the text by using techniques such as summarization. As students get better at thinking within the text they are encouraged to also think about the text, increasing their understanding with techniques such as analysis and critique. Ultimately this leads the early readers to think beyond the text using techniques such as making inferences about what the writer means but didn't state in the text. With Fountas and Pinnell Guided Reading our students will continue to reach higher and higher on our Galactic Journey and the future is looking bright.

The Medical Pavilion

The foundation is forming for our 63,000 square foot three story medical office building. **The Medical Pavilion is scheduled to open in February 2021.** This state-of-the art facility will be home to Alamogordo Surgical Associates, Champion Orthopaedics, White Sands Women's Health and Alamogordo Cardiology.

We are continuing to recruit medical staff to meet the needs of the community however our current facilities are full. We will be under construction in different locations of the campus through spring of 2022.

The emergency department is expanding by 8,000 square feet and the current space will receive complete renovation. Champion Cancer Center will expand by 2000 square feet with some renovation to current space. We do not anticipate a need to close any services throughout the construction period.

There will be approximately 150 people employed during the height of this construction project. We will keep the community informed of major changes that affect entrance and access to services.



CENSUS IMPACT IN OUR COMMUNITY

The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next 10 years. Census results affect planning and funding for education - including programs such as Head Start, Pell Grants, school lunches, rural education, adult education, and grants for preschool special education. It also affects planning and funding for healthcare - including programs such as Medicaid, Medicare Part B, State Children's Health Insurance, and the prevention and treatment of substance abuse. Census data also effects the funding we receive for roads, water and public safety.

IMPORTANT DATES

March 12 - 20: Households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail.

April 1: Census Day is observed nationwide. By this date, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, phone, or mail. When you respond to the census, you'll tell the Census Bureau where you live as of April 1, 2020.
