

Alamogordo Public Schools



The unprecedented health risk that has shaped the narrative of 2020, the COVID-19 epidemic, has affected the New Mexico school systems as much as or maybe even more so than the public at large. The disruption at the end of the 2019-2020 school year that shut the doors of Alamogordo Public Schools created innovation in teaching the students of the district when a virtual learning environment was utilized to further our students learning and improvement. And while Education Week reported that only half of students across New Mexico were engaged in learning during this time, Alamogordo Public Schools had 94% of students learning digitally with others learning through packets and with 99% of students and families contacted during this time.

Now the NM Public Education Department has set guidance for the upcoming 2020-2021 school year, emphasizing a hybrid learning model. So what is a hybrid learning model? It means that the students of New Mexico will have part-time in class instruction time with a limited amount of students per class to observe social distancing and all of the NM Department of Health guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19. These students will also have instruction through the virtual learning environment, allowing cleaning of the schools.

Based on NMPED guidance, Alamogordo Public Schools has announced the Fall 2020 re-entry plan, which highlights choices for parents.

Zika Alert

The two mosquito species in the United States that can transmit Zika virus have been found in some parts of southern New Mexico. These mosquitoes are also capable of transmitting other diseases to people, such as dengue and chikungunya viruses. These two species of mosquitoes like to live near people, either indoors or outdoors, and mostly bite during the daytime. People can protect themselves from Zika virus and other mosquito-borne diseases by following these prevention suggestions:

- Use an EPA-approved insect repellent. Make sure to follow the instructions on the label so that you use repellents safely.
- Cover skin with long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
- Keep mosquitoes out of homes and hotel rooms.

The following active ingredients provide the longest-lasting protection:

- DEET (up to 30%)
- Picaridin
- Oil of lemon eucalyptus
- Para-menthane diol
- IR3535



What we know about Zika and pregnancy:

- Zika virus can be passed from a pregnant woman to her fetus.
- Infection during pregnancy can cause a birth defect called microcephaly and other severe fetal brain defects
- Zika primarily spreads through infected mosquitoes.
- You can also get Zika through sex without a condom with someone infected by Zika, even if that person does not show symptoms of Zika.
- There is no vaccine to prevent or medicine to treat Zika.

NM Department of Health

(This information valid as of end of July 1, 2020) Our local NMDOH - Public Health office (1207 8th Street, Alamogordo) continues to provide services, through mitigated methods with COVID19 safe practices in place. Delivery varies by program - as follows: WIC is loading benefits and delivering cards to clients in the parking lot, plus conducting phone visits and check ins (437-9093). Clinical services see patients as needed. Patients do not wait inside the waiting room and are screened before coming in. Families First and Children's Medical Services programs have been conducting assessments and client visits by phone (call to learn more: 437-9340). Birth certificates are delivered to clients out in the parking lot (available Mondays only). Drive-through COVID19 testing is by appointment, in the parking lot. Appointments can be scheduled by calling 437-9340 ext 4. The Registered Nurse also conducts site-based COVID19 testing, scheduled upon request (437-9340 ext 4). The Health Promotion Specialist is available for community capacity building and resource gap support (contact Maureen: 437-9340 ext 5).

- Childhood immunizations are still being offered by appointment. It is crucial to keep up with your child's shots. Call for information.

- Protect yourself and others, and prevent the spread of COVID19 by wearing a face mask, minimizing your outings, and washing hands frequently.
