
Animal Control

Summer Hours at Collection Center



With Spring right around the corner, the Alamogordo Collection Center will move to its summer hours.

Starting **March 12, 2017**, hours at the Collection Center will be **Monday—Thursday, 9:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m.** and **Friday—Saturday, 9:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m.**

The Alamogordo Collection Center is located at 224 LaVelle Road and is a solid waste transfer station that accepts household garbage, furniture, yard waste, used motor oil, anti-freeze, cell phones and cell phone batteries, household appliances and scrap metal. The facility serves City residents and small construction contractors. Customers are required to bring their materials to the facility. Mulch is free to the public. The facility also accepts commercial waste.

No liquids (other than what's mentioned above), hazardous waste, or animal remains are accepted at the center.

MainStreet Alamogordo



MainStreet in New Mexico is a highly visible, respected, and credible grassroots community economic development program that is recognized for its ability to support local initiatives to restore economic vitality and growth to the state's town centers while preserving local cultural and historic resources. At its heart, Alamogordo MainStreet is and will always be (by design) a non-profit run by local volunteers. Partnerships with the city, county, state, other non-profits, and private investors, as well as the generation of public donations and support are all essential to leveraging the full benefits the program has to offer.

As of now, Alamogordo MainStreet is working closely with the City of Alamogordo in receiving a New Mexico Finance Authority grant for \$50,000, specifically marked for the purchase of a comprehensive Metropolitan Redevelopment Area (MRA) plan! The grant requires no match from the city or our organization and essentially will provide us with an extremely valuable tool and guide to help us further economically develop and beautify our historic downtown district.

The MRA plan will outline downtown Alamogordo's historical assets, areas that need improvement, vacant spaces, economic impacts and development issues, suggested projects (both large and small scale), and valuable funding sources just to name a few! Developing the MRA plan is not a quick process, however, we are hoping to have it completed by the end of 2017 and very much look forward to engaging in the development process as a whole.

More important than ever, Alamogordo MainStreet is always on the lookout for volunteers, advocates, investors, and contributors who all provide the backbone of this community-driven initiative.
